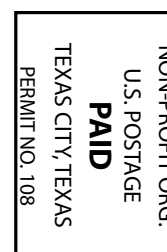
First Steps

A Message from Robert Miller

Good-bye 2020!!!

2020 has been a forgettable year that we will never forget. Millions getting sick and dying throughout the world. The entire country was shut down, including churches, for months. I watched people in our area and the country lose jobs, businesses, and hope.

2020 has been difficult for me. I lost my brother, I lost some really good friends to Co-vid, and I watched church members have to struggle and go through sickness and death; and I, their pastor, wasn't allowed to visit them in the hospital. It has been the weirdest year ever being a pastor. I could not see sick folks, I preached to empty seats, and our church had to conduct business meetings through email. I dislike doing church like we have had to do. But God has been good, and we see the light at the end of the tunnel.

Though 2020 hasn't been easy or useful, I have to admit some good things I am taking from 2020. Let me look at the bright side of an ugly year.

First, it has helped us all to consider what is most important in life—getting together with others in family gatherings, worshiping with our church family, and appreciating our jobs, grocery shopping, and eating out.

Second, I now realize that all of us are essential, and all our jobs are crucial. Who knew grocery clerks, farmers, and truck drivers were essential? They always were, but now we know it.

Third, who knew that so many folks would watch worship and teaching on Livestream? We now have more views for our Sunday morning worship than we had physically attending worship before. Our congregation, when we count those on Livestream, has doubled. Speaking of essential workers, I appreciate all our tech folks and especially our Livestream folks that volunteer to provide worship every Sunday. My Coffee with the Pastor, a short daily devotional teaching, has more viewing than we have in attendance at Sunday School on Sundays. Without the shut-down, we would not have known about this powerful outreach tool.

Fourth, I have learned not to be in such a hurry all the time. Dallas Willard once said, "ruthlessly eliminate hurry from your life." For some strange reason, my pace has slowed during the pandemic. I hope to continue this pace after the pandemic is over.

Fifth, I have learned to appreciate our church members more. During the shut-down, our members stepped up and continued to give faithfully. Also, many of our membership has not been able to return physically to church. I miss them a lot! 2021 has to be better!!! Bring on a New Year!
