

A Message from Dennis Johns

Well, I must say congratulations to the Baylor Bears Men's Basketball team on their National Championship, and even to those fans who will choose to remind me that it wasn't my team who brought the trophy back to Texas. I would have loved to have seen how Bro. Grayson Glass reacted to Baylor's victory; he was a huge fan and supporter. I don't think he would have rubbed it in on me too bad, but I am fairly sure that when I get to heaven he will want to have a discussion about it.

The theme of Wednesday nights for student ministry recently has been "Lost & Found." We have discussed the parables of Luke 15: the lost sheep, the lost coin and the prodigal son. This week we focus on the older brother who was faithful and obedient during the prodigal's absence. The compelling beauty of the compassionate and welcoming father is totally lost on the older brother as he refuses to celebrate the homecoming of his "wild child" sibling. His resentment and bitterness keeps him from joining the celebration even after his father pleads with him to see things in a different light. He said, "My son, you are always with me and everything I have is yours. But we had to celebrate and be glad, because this brother of yours was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found." Luke 15:31-32. This is where Jesus leaves the story. It was as if Jesus was letting the Pharisees (to whom the parable was presented) decide how it was to end. They were left to make a decision of whether they would join the celebration or remain "lost" in their resentment. We are left to make that choice almost every day; will we forgive and live, or will we fret and regret.

I know that the subject of sports and championships probably isn't the best "lead in" to the story of the prodigal son, but I think a closer look at how we respond to God's gracious forgiveness in the lives of others is a necessary route that we must be willing to take in these days of confusion and misdirected angst. When our self-righteousness gets in the way of celebrating God's redemptive grace in the lives of others, we are no better than the Pharisees. Let us choose to be intentional in uprooting resentment and bitterness and see the benefits of celebrating victories. Way to go Bears!
